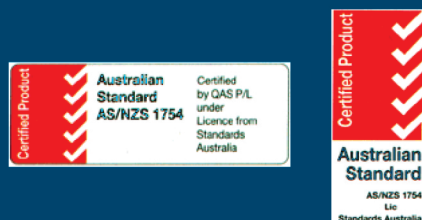

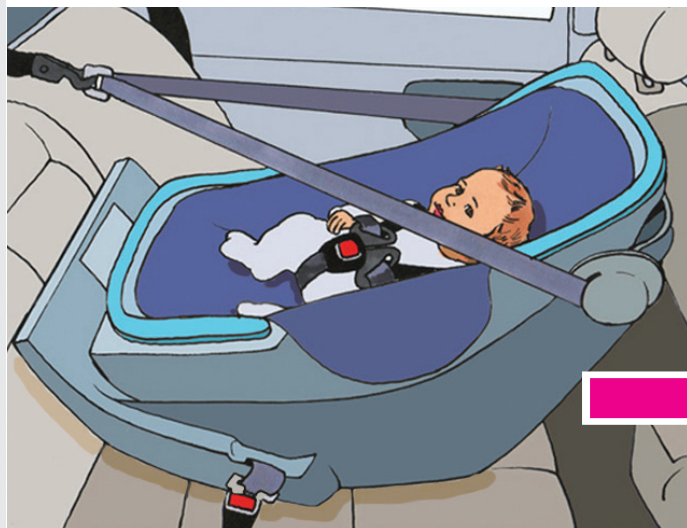

STAGE 1

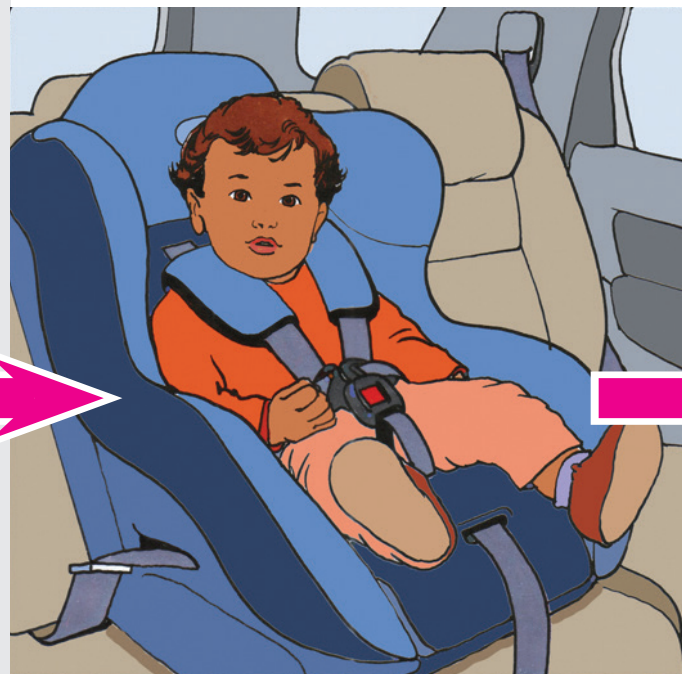


Birth to 6 months – Infant Restraint

(Always follow manufacturers' instructions.)

- Must be in a rearward facing child restraint.
- Keep your baby rearward facing until they have exceeded the restraints size limits, and can sit unaided.

STAGE 2



6 months to 4 years – Toddler Restraint

(Always follow manufacturers' instructions.)

- Use either a rearward or forward facing child restraint.

STAGE 3



4 years to 7 years – Booster Seat

(Always follow manufacturers' instructions.)

- Use either a forward facing child restraint with inbuilt harness or booster seat with adult seatbelt.

CHECKLIST

Birth to 6 months



- Infant carrier/capsule
- Rearward facing convertible restraint

Stage 1

6 months to 4 years



- Rearward/forward facing convertible restraint
- Toddler restraint
- Combination restraint with inbuilt harness

Stage 2

4 to 7 years



- Toddler restraint with inbuilt harness
- Booster seat with adult seatbelt
- Booster seat with accessory child harness

Stage 3

Children are safest in the back.
It is against the law for children under 7 years to sit in the front seat.

Children should remain in their restraints until they have exceeded the size limits before progressing to the next stage.
