Stop, look, listen, think

Your child needs to understand why each step of the STOP LOOK LISTEN THINK procedure is important.

Here are some questions to ask your child when you practise crossing the road together.

STOP


Is this a good place to cross the road?
Can you see the traffic coming in all directions?
Can the drivers see you?
Why have we stopped back from the road?

Why have we stopped back from the road? Why do you need to stop before crossing?



LOOK

What are we looking for?
Is any traffic coming?
Can you see the traffic if you only look straight ahead?
Why do you need to look in all directions?
Where else could traffic come from?




LISTEN

What do you need to listen for? Can you hear any traffic coming? Which direction is the sound coming from?



THINK

Is it safe to cross now?
Is the road clear in all directions?
Can you hear any other traffic coming?
Can you get all the way across safely?
Is there somewhere to wait if you have to stop halfway?
