Key messages for children

- Buckle up every trip every time.
- Everyone has to wear a restraint.

Key points

- The term 'restraint' refers to all child car restraints and lap sash belts or seat belts.
- Children 0-7years must use an approved / Australian Standard (AS/NZ1754) child car restraint.
- Best practice reveals that children require height and weight appropriate restraints until they are much older.
- All occupants of a car must wear a restraint if available.
- Child car restraints are selected on size and height, not the age of the child.
- Do not use a restraint that has been involved in a crash.
- Child car restraints less than 10 years old are recommended.
- Do not use a restraint that is older than 10 years unless there is no other alternative.
