## Stage 1



## Birth to at least 6 months

- Must be in a rearward facing child restraint with inbuilt harness.
- Keep your baby rearward facing until they meet the restraint's size limits.

## Stage 2



## At least 6 months to 4 years

Use either a rearward or forward facing child restraint with inbuilt harness.

## Stage 3



## At least 4 years to 7 years

Use either a forward facing child restraint with inbuilt harness or booster seat with an adult seatbelt or a child safety harness.

Birth to at least 6 months

Infant carrier/capsule Rearward facing convertible restraint



At least 6 months to 4 years

Rearward/forward facing (or convertible) restraint Combination restraint with

inbuilt harness



At least 4 years to 7 years

Forward facing restraint with inbuilt harness

Booster seat with adult seatbelt

Booster seat with accessory child harness



### Children are safest in the back.

It is against the law for children under 7 years to sit in the front seat.\*

\* Exemptions exist

Children **should** remain in their restraints until they have exceeded the size limits, **before** progressing to the next stage. **Always** follow manufacturers' instructions.

- Must be less than10 years old
- If you have a car accident you must replace your child car restraints
