Title of task	What sign is that?
Task description	In this task students will identify road signs found in their local area explaining their meaning and why the directions on the signs should be followed.

Suggested time and assessment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> One lesson of in-class time

📌 Note

For this task, teachers will need to locate images or take photos of different road signs found in their local community.

1. As a class, show the images of different types of road signs that appear in the local community. For each sign, prompt discussion using the following questions.

- What shape is the sign?
- What colours are used on the sign? What do these colours tell you eg red = danger.
- Are there any words on this sign? What are these words? What do they mean?
- Are there any pictures on this sign? What do these pictures show? What is the message?
- Have you seen this sign? Where have you seen this sign?
- What do you have to do when you see this sign? (Note: Encourage students to act out what they would do, or tell/explain)
- Why is it important to follow the directions on this sign?

2. Form pairs or small groups. Randomly distribute a sign to each pair/group.

3. Share the following story with students.

You have a new class member from another country. Can you help them to understand the road signs in your local community? Explain to them what the sign is saying and why they should follow the sign's message.

4. Working with each pair/small group, observe and record their discussion about what they could say to this new student. Monitor discussion, prompting with additional questions as required.

📌 Note

This activity could also be structured as purposeful play. For example, using the [Smart Steps traffic play mat](#), teachers can guide students to interact with the traffic mat and initiate conversation to identify students' knowledge and understanding of road signs.
